

These poppy seeds are tasty and have a good crunch to them. Mine had substantial plant matter in all 3 bags, so bakers probably want to sift the seeds to keep plant matter out of your baked goods. For those who are uneware, this means they are unprocessed and unwashed which is what you want in poppy seeds. Don't return the bags if you find plant matter in your seeds, it's normal! They retain an earthy, bitter, nutty flavor and taste way better than the processed/already washed stuff. It makes the difference between an "okay" mulfin and a "great!" mulfin.

A BILL

To prohibit the sale of food that is, or contains, unsafe poppy seeds.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Stephen Hacala Poppy"

5 Seed Safety Act".

6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS; PURPOSE.

- 7 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds as follows:
- 8 (1) Stephen Hacala was a 24-year-old from
- 9 Fayetteville, Arkansas, who was dearly loved by fam-
- 10 ily and friends when he died from morphine intoxica-

- tion caused by consumption of contaminated poppy
- seeds.

3 (2) More than a dozen people in the United 4 States have been confirmed to have died from mor-

5 phine overdoses from contaminated poppy seeds.

6 (b) PURPOSE.-It is the purpose of this Act to pro-

7 hibit the distribution and sale of contaminated poppy

8 seeds in order to prevent harm, addiction, and further

9 deaths from morphine-laced poppy seeds.

10 SEC. 3. UNSAFE POPPY SEEDS AS ADULTERANTS IN FOOD.

Section 301 of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic
Act (21 U.S.C. 331) is amended by adding at the end the
following:

14 "(fff) Selling, or offering to sell, directly to con-15 sumers a food that is or contains poppy seeds, including 16 concentrates, metabolites, constituents, or extracts of 17 poppy seeds, that contain levels of morphine, codeine, or 18 other alkaloid compounds that may render the food inju-19 rious to health.".
