





# FDA's Strategy for the Safety of Imported Food



- FDA published the Strategy for the Safety of Imported Food in February 2019.
  - Describes how FDA intends to integrate the new import provisions in the Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA) with existing/traditional authorities, primarily at the port of entry.
  - Identifies key principles: public health is the top priority; partnerships are key to success; science and innovation are foundational; level playing field for foreign and domestic producers; risk-based resource allocation; measurement and transparency.
- New Era of Smarter Food Safety announced in April 2019 builds on FSMA and seeks to leverage new and emerging technologies to create a more digital, traceable, and safer food system.
- Several concepts foreshadowed in the Strategy for the Safety of Imported Food are a natural fit within the New Era of Smarter Food Safety which will become the frame of reference in the decade to come.

- Balance public health protection mission with doing our part to slow the spread of coronavirus
- The work we do is supported by the potential risk of that work
- Focused on the highest risk problem areas and the highest risk products
- Includes both surveillance coverage and “for cause” targeting



# Foods Program Activities during COVID

- Examination/Sampling – general surveillance
  - Microbiological contamination in foods
  - Decomposition in histamine-forming seafood
  - Undeclared allergens in foods
  - Toxic elements in foods
  - Antibiotics in seafood



# Foods Program Activities during COVID

- COVID-19 specific activities
  - Surveillance of products from foreign food firms whose establishment inspections has been postponed
    - Increased surveillance of products manufactured/shipped by identified firms
    - Also specific targeting for some high risk products
- Non-food related
  - Similar surveillance of foreign drug firms with postponed inspection
  - Prevention of entry of fraudulent COVID-19 medical products
  - Personal protective equipment/medical devices



# Foods Program Activities during COVID

- Foreign Supplier Verification Program Inspections
  - Conducted under remote protocol
  - Conducted more than 200 so far
  - Prioritizing importers of products from foreign firms whose FDA establishment inspection was postponed
  - Also inspecting firms planned to do this year
- Majority of feedback has been positive
  - Both from FDA investigators and importers
  - Will assess including as part of our routine activities, post-COVID



# Foods Program Activities during COVID

- Trends
  - Roughly 12% decrease in foods import volume compared to 2019 (March – to date)
  - Conducting fewer field examinations and sample collections
    - More targeted to higher risk areas
  - Maintaining similar violation rates
