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Organic Certification Requirements

- Complete Traceability
 - From seed to sale
- Certification categories
 - International standards
 - Organic status (100%, 95%, 70% made with)
 - Handler and Processor
- Managing documentation and Goods
- Certification cost

Challenges with Organic Standards

- Pesticides
 - Direct and indirect application
 - Small vs. Large farmers
 - NOP 5% Rule vs. European Union
- Product consistency can be variable
 - Resources of farmers & processing capabilities
 - Nature of organic farming practices
 - Metal and foreign material
- Treatment options to reduce microbial load
 - Dry steam, heat, CO₂, and ozone
- Vendor Verification

Regional Issues

- Climate and weather pattern changes
 - Drought and seasonal changes
- Increasing demand within producing countries reduces desire to export
 - Fresh market
 - Emerging middle class
- Due to these factors it's important to have multiple sources for each commodity

Government Issues

- Due to increases in government resources and food safety concerns, import inspections have increased
 - Need to build in costs associated with inspections and adjust shipping times
 - Increased risk of container refusals, due to noxious weeds and pest infestation
