FSMA Major Final Rules Timeline 2015

August 30th

- Preventive controls for human food
- Preventive controls for animal feed

October 31st

- Produce safety
- Foreign Supplier Verification Program (FSVP)
- 3rd Party Audit and Accreditation

2016

March 31st

Sanitary Transportation

May 31st

Intentional Adulteration



FSMA PC Compliance Dates

Enforcement periods will be tiered. Clock begins upon publishing of the final regulation:

- 1 year for large businesses
- 2 years for small businesses
- 3 years for very small businesses

*Due to Court order the FSMA final rules must be published no later than the dates indicated above. In any case a rule is published before the deadline, the enforcement period for the compliance date begins as of the date it is published.
